Office of the County Clerk, March 24, 2026.

The Board met pursuant to adjournment, and was called to order by Chairperson Gabrielson at 7:02 p.m. in the County Board Room, located at 320 South Walnut Street, Appleton, Wisconsin.

ROLL CALL: 33 present, 3 absent. Members present: Thompson, Johnson, Smith, Patience, Gabrielson, Kostelny, Hammen, Krueger, Lamers, Ferguson, McCabe, Wegand, Hermes, MacDonald, Zabronsky, Croatt, Spears, Heiser, Mitchell, Cuff, Hagen, Klemp, Thiede, Janke, Culbertson, Winterfeldt, Nejedlo, Clegg, Thyssen, VanderHeiden, Rettler, Koury, and Lautenschlager. Members absent: Supervisors Lawrence, Weinberg and Monfils.

The Board Chairperson requested the Board's confirmation to excuse Supervisors Lawrence, Weinberg and Monfils. No objections; so ordered.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Chairperson Gabrielson.

MINUTES OF THE MARCH 10, 2026 COUNTY BOARD MEETING –

Supervisor Koury moved, seconded by Supervisor Croatt, to approve the minutes of the March 10, 2026 County Board meeting.

ROLL CALL: 31 yes, 2 abstain (Wegand, Thyssen), 3 absent. THE MINUTES OF THE MARCH 10, 2026 COUNTY BOARD MEETING ARE APPROVED.

SPECIAL ORDER OF BUSINESS –

Chairperson Dan Gabrielson took the time to recognize and thank the two (2) outgoing County Board Supervisors who are retiring from the board, as they decided not to run for the 2026-28 County Board term.

Chairperson Gabrielson recognized Supervisor Thyssen, who started his work with the County Board in 2020. Supervisor Thyssen spent the first four (4) years on Highway/Solid Waste/Recycling Committee, and then transferred in 2024 to the Public Safety Committee.

Chairperson Gabrielson recognized Supervisor Rettler who started his service to the County Board in 2012. He served his entire run working on the Agriculture, Extension Education, Zoning, and Land Conservation Committee, where from 2015-2020 he served as Chairman.

ESTABLISH ORDER OF THE DAY–

Chairperson Gabrielson requested to have all appointments and resolutions locked in at the meeting, as this is the final meeting of the 2025-26 County Board term; doing so will close out all the business for the term. No objections; so ordered.

COMMUNICATIONS – Communications Referral List (included in the packet)

Chairperson Gabrielson summarized the following communications:

- The WiFi access point for the County Board has been updated – any County Board member having issues with their devices (like their County provided iPad), please reach out to Sara Hickey in Legislative Services.
- Due to the ongoing impact of partial government shutdown effecting the Outagamie County’s ATW Airport, Legislative Services Office is holding a collection for the TSA agents for the airport. These staff are not getting paid on the federal level, but are still working to ensure the airport operations continue to run smoothly. The collection will be used to purchase gas cards and grocery cards. If interested in donating, please see Legislative Services.
- There are 17 Supervisors who still need to complete the most recently sent out cyber security training course, titled *Core Concepts: Smishing*. Please complete the training as soon as possible.
- Walt Ulbricht, Winnebago County Supervisor, died unexpectedly on March 15, 2026. He was running for reelection. He was heavily involved with UW-Fox Valley (Extension); condolences to his family and friends.
- April is National County Government Month, which highlights the essential services and programs provided by county governments. The month recognizes all of public servants who work at the departments, which keep essential services running, so that our communities continue to be safe, healthy and connected.
- Thank you to all of the essential employees who came into work during Snowstorm Elsa event last week. He specifically called out a number of county departments (Highway Department, Dispatch, Sheriff’s Department, Brewster Village, Health and Human Services, Shelter Care, Crisi and Public Health, Airport staff (including ensuring the snow removal on the runways), and of course, facilities for their dedication in the snow removal of our numerous buildings, roadways, sidewalks and parking lots.
- Chair Gabrielson highlighted a news story that occurred during Snowstorm Elsa – Highway crews played life-saving role on Monday morning of March 17, 2026. The night prior, all medical transfers from the Shawano Medical Hospital were put on hold due to the snowstorm causing dangerous travel conditions. On Monday morning, two (2) urgent transports were desperately needed to receive care from higher level medical facilities, and a Shawano County plow truck escorted the two (2) Shawano County Ambulances to the Shawano County/Outagamie County line, whereupon the Shawano County ambulance met up with one of our Outagamie County plow truck drivers who escorted them to a regional medical center.
- As this is the last County Board meeting for this session, the 2024-26 County Board enacted on a total of 385 resolutions and ordinances this session.
- Chairperson Gabrielson recognized the following County Board Supervisor birthdays: Supervisor Krueger (4/3) and Supervisor MacDonald (4/11).

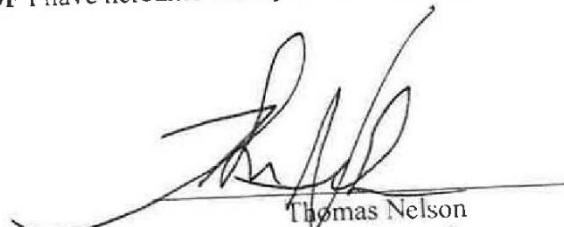
DISASTER PROCLAMATION
