

Outagamie County Request for Proposal 2026 Epoxy Pavement Marking

Attachment A – Special Provisions

1. General

Perform the work under this proposal for the furnishing and installing epoxy pavement markings for highway construction and maintenance for Outagamie County, Wisconsin. Execute the work as specified in the Standard Specifications for Highway and Structure Construction of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (Standard Specifications), current edition, Wisconsin Department of Transportation Construction and Materials Manual (CMM), and these Special Provisions. References to the Department or State in the Standard Specifications shall, in most instances, mean Outagamie County. The term “Engineer” shall mean an authorized representative of the Outagamie County Highway Department. The special provisions in this proposal shall supplement and take precedence over the above-mentioned specifications.

If all or a portion of the plans and special provisions are developed in the SI metric system and the schedule of prices is developed in the US standard measure system, the department will pay for the work as bid in the US standard system.

2. Scope of Work

The work under this proposal consists of removing existing thermoplastic and epoxy-based pavement markings and furnishing and placing new epoxy-based pavement marking items including longlines, channelizing and transverse markings, words, symbols, and ancillary items, and all incidental items necessary to complete the work as included in this proposal.

3. Prosecution and Progress

The Department will request services for epoxy pavement marking for routine pavement markings to be completed during the 2026 construction season. The amount of work performed will be based upon the unit prices or lump sum pricing received. The Department will make final determination on the work to be completed prior to contract award and based upon the pricing received with all work being awarded to a single contractor. Performance of work shall be completed within an allowable timeframe and shall not be subject to cold marking conditions as specified by the standard specifications (i.e. no additional payment will be made for cold weather marking). Traffic control may be provided by Department forces or shall be specified as an additional cost in the bid. A detailed traffic control plan will be requested prior to any pavement marking work. Complete closure of intersections may be allowed but should be assumed to occur during overnight working hours.

4. Location of Services

All pricing reflected on the bid forms shall be based on performing work at the specific locations identified in the plan documents. Additional work may be requested from the awarded contractor outside of these areas but will be considered extra work. Extra work may include County highway projects, improvements on or at County-owned facilities, or highway-related work for the State, Townships or municipalities within Outagamie County. A current map of County highways is available from the Highway website or available upon request.

5. General Requirements for Epoxy Pavement Marking

A General

This special provision describes furnishing and installing epoxy pavement markings on Department routine maintenance projects as shown in the plan documents.

Perform work in accordance to the applicable sections of the standard specifications and as follows.

B Materials

Furnish epoxy and glass beads in accordance with the pertinent requirements of section 646.2 of the standard specifications. In addition, only furnish materials from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation's (WisDOT) Approved Products List (APL) unless otherwise approved by the Department in writing.

C Construction & Execution

Perform all work in accordance to section 646.3 of the standard specifications and section 650 of the CMM.

The Department may provide traffic control support and signing for pavement marking operations. For all other instances, the contractor shall provide adequate traffic control or a follow vehicle, depending on the scope and location of the intended pavement marking. Coordinate specific project instructions or directions with the Superintendent, Project Supervisor, or as assigned by a Department crew member.

Proving Period conditions shall apply to the work completed under this proposal, and shall be accepted based on the conditions of section 646.3.1.6 of the standard specifications.

D Measurement

The Department will measure all work acceptably completed in accordance with the applicable standard specification for each respective work item.

E Payment

If a contract is awarded under the *Unit Pricing* bid option, the Department will pay for measured quantities at the proposed unit price in accordance with the applicable standard specification for each respective item included in the proposal, and as modified below.

If a contract is awarded under the *Lump Sum* bid option, the Department will pay for measured quantities at the proposed lump sum price for each location acceptably completed.

Payment is full compensation for furnishing and installing all materials; for transport and delivery of equipment to the project site to complete the work; for mobilizing to the site; and for all incidental items necessary to complete the work included in this proposal, including submittal of daily timesheets, charge sheets and required documentation.

The Department will consider adjustments to unit pricing for any proposed unit price that increases or decreases in cost by more than 25%, as long as the cost increase/decrease is shown to be industry wide. Requests for price adjustments may be initiated by the contractor or the Department with applicable supporting documentation, and shall use the requirements of subsection 104.2.2.4.3 of the standard specification as a basis for considering an adjustment to the contract price.

Proposed unit prices shall remain in effect until March 31, 2027.
